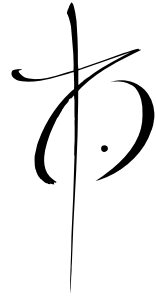

Kingsfold, the tune of today's presentation hymn, is a traditional English melody first published by Lucy Etheldred Broadwood and J.A. Fuller Maitland in *English Country Songs* in 1893. Ralph Vaughan Williams arranged and harmonized the tune when he edited *The English Hymnal* for the Church of England in 1906. The tune was named for a village in Surrey, England where Vaughan Williams heard a variant of the melody.

The Irish know the tune as *The Star of the County Down* and the Pasadena Singers will sing a version of that tune commissioned from Philip Lawson on their concert on March 3 on their *Friends of Music* concert at PPC.
